There is a provision to provide only 50 per cent of the land free of cost under the Bharatmala. The Madhya Pradesh Government is providing 100 per cent land worth ₹421 crore free of cost to



complete this dream project. Apart from this, the State Government as a financial Government as a financial assistance will provide ₹330 crore in the form of royalty of soil and muroom and will also bear the expenditure of ₹30 crore to be incurred on per-

missions of forest land. Thus the State Government will pro-vide total financial assistance of ₹781 crore. Chouhan informed that the 'Express Way' will be 309 k.m. long in the State. It will connect the boundaries of

Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh via Sheopur, Morena and Bhind. This route will be con-Bhind, This route will be con-nected to the Golden Quadrilateral (Agra-Kanpur) route in Bhind, North-South Corridor in Morena and Delhi Mumbai Corridor in Rajasthan. The area will receive industrial investment due to smooth and convenient tran-

route. Besides, the Chief Minister Besides, the Chief Minister Chouhan asid that for eco-nomic/industrial development, this area will be developed by the State Government for defense production, food pro-cessing, heavy industry, ware-housing, logistics and transport industries.
