

OMC case: SC overturns HC order discharging Srilakshmi

The Supreme Court has in its interim decision set aside a High Court order quashing the case against the IAS officer Y Srilakshmi in the alleged Obulapuram Mining Company (OMC) case.

The apex court could be a big setback for Srilakshmi. The SC passed the order in the case of appeal filed by Telangana government against her.

The Supreme Court has directed for a renewed probe into her alleged involvement, in the alleged OMC case, directing

that the investigation should be done in the next three months.

She was allegedly involved in the illegal mining of iron ore in the Bellary Reserve Forest in Obulapuram and Malapanagudi villages in Anantapur district of the undivided Andhra Pradesh.

In 2022, the HC had ruled in favour of Srilakshmi, discharging her from the OMC case.

The CBI, probe agency in the case, filed its chargesheet in 2011 and recorded Srilakshmi as the accused number six in the case in the supplementary chargesheet it had filed in 2012.

SC refuses to stay T'gana's KRMB gazette notification

THE Supreme Court has observed that granting a stay on the implementation of the gazette notification issued by the central government, which notifies the jurisdiction of the Krishna River Management Board (KRMB), would be disastrous.

During the hearing of the petition filed by the Telangana government challenging the notification, asked the State government to explain why it

should stay a notification issued in 2021. "These notifications have survived for three years now. Why do you want a stay now?" the Court asked.

In response, CS Vaidhyanathan, senior advocate representing Telangana, said the notification was not being implemented.

The bench then asked, "Then why are you seeking a stay? Granting such relief is not permissible."

Vaidhyanathan replied, "It is not being implemented because it cannot be implemented. The

KRMB considered the apportionment between Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. A second water disputes tribunal was constituted in 2004, and an award was passed, which was stayed by the Supreme Court."

Jaideep Gupta, senior advocate representing Andhra Pradesh, said the notification was being implemented.

He further argued that the new States of AP and Telangana came into existence in 2014, and therefore, there has been no inter-state allocation until now.

CM flags off 214 buses on DMK's 4th anniv

CHIEF Minister MK Stalin on Wednesday flagged off 214 new buses for six transportation corporations at Island Ground in Chennai. He also interacted with women commuters aboard a government bus operating under the Vidyal Payanam scheme — which provides free bus rides for women — in Chennai, as the DMK government completes four years after assuming office in May 2021.

An official stated that while travelling from the Secretariat to the Anna Centenary Library, the CM boarded route number 32B — running from Vallalar Nagar to Vivekananda Illam — at the Omandurar Government Estate bus stop. During the journey, he spoke with women commuters and inquired about the scheme's impact as it enters its fifth year since implementation.

The women commuters shared that the initiative has helped them save around ₹2,000 per month, which they now use for essential expenses like healthcare, education and others.

The CM directed the bus crew to ensure that buses halt at designated stops so women can benefit from the scheme. Out of 214 new buses, 27 were allocated to SETC, 114 to Villupuram TNSTC, 10 to Salem, 31 to Coimbatore, 14 to Madurai and 18 to the Tirunelveli division. Of these, 70 buses are ordinary services operating under the Magalir Vidyal Payanam scheme, as per an official statement.

MOCK DRILL CONDUCTED ACROSS STATE TO ASSESS EMERGENCY RESPONSE

AMID escalating India-Pakistan tensions, the Visakhapatnam district administration conducted a series of civil and blackout mock drills across the city on Wednesday to educate the public on how to respond effectively during emergencies such as terrorist attacks, bomb blasts, or fire incidents. These exercises were carried out in accordance with guidelines issued by the central government.

It may be noted that Vizag district has been categorised as a Category-II target by the Centre.

The civil mock drills were held at key locations, including Queen Mary's Girls High School and junctions in the One Town area. Multiple departments took part in the exercise, including Civil Defence, Fire Services, the State and National Disaster Response Forces (SDRF and NDRF), Police, Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC), Revenue, Civil Supplies, Health Department, and trained volunteers.

At the One Town Centre, a simulated terror attack involving smoke bombs was staged across two buildings. Firefighters responded swiftly to contain the fire, while NDRF and SDRF personnel, equipped with protective gear, rescued individuals from the affected buildings. Rescue operations included evacuation through staircases and ladders. The injured were given

first aid at temporary medical camps set up near the site.

At Queen Mary Girls High School, SDRF teams conducted a separate demonstration focusing on evacuation procedures during a mock terror situation.

Senior officials, including SDRF Inspector General Raja Kumar, District Collector M N Harendhira Prasad, Police Commissioner Shankha Brata Bagchi, and Joint Collector K Mayur Ashok, supervised the drills. In the evening, blackout



drills were held in areas including One Town and Oxygen Towers in Seethammadhara. These drills simulated emergency situations where power might be intentionally cut during potential terror strikes to disrupt operations. Vizag Collector MN Harendhira Prasad announced that mock drills will soon be conducted in all ward secretariats to improve public awareness and preparedness. Other district authorities in AP including Bapatla, Ambedkar Konaseema, Sree Satya Sai, Tirupati, Prakasam and Kurnool also conducted mock drills to enhance emergency preparedness.



In Bapatla, a mock terror attack drill at Bapatla Railway Station, supervised by Additional SP TP Vithaleswar, saw police, fire, health, railway, and revenue teams respond within ten minutes. They conducted searches, evacuated passengers, and provided first aid to simulated casualties, educating commuters on staying calm.

Collector J Venkata Murali, at a Suryalanka Air Base meeting, reviewed coordination, noting the base's radar can detect missile activity within 200 km, triggering evacuation sirens. Control rooms and landline communication were planned to ensure connectivity.

At a meeting with ONGC, Vedanta, and GAIL existing measures like cybersecurity, CCTV, and no-drone zones at Tatipaka and Odalarevu were highlighted. In Sri Satya Sai, a drill at Sri Satya Sai Airport, overseen by Collector T S Chetan and SP V Ratna, focused on terrorist attack response.

Kurnool's Civil Defence drill at Konda Reddy Fort followed Home Ministry SOPs, guiding people to safe zones after sirens.
